PREDICATION

This report is motivated by receipt of urgent indications and warning for December 2025 below. This information added to our prior reporting indicates with HIGH confidence of imminent planned attacks, and specific to churches across the nation, focusing on veteran and military congregations.

SITUATION

Since its incorporation Obscura raw threat intelligence reporting, analysis and warnings has predicted the current pre-attack threat environment and has observed escalation and target intelligence collection by enemy forces. This includes the combined mutual aid axis of Communist, Islamist anarchist strategic, operational, and tactical fronts across the U.S. and noted the specific targeting of Christian activities, revivals, and churches. The previously reported Red-Green Alliance, including the noted spike in the assassination of Charlie Kirk and threats to his organization that continue. In Obscura assessed with HIGH Confidence, well before the reporting below. This includes the Washington DC attack within the last 72 hours, HIGH confidence that more of these attacks are coming.

In Obscura subscribes to several like sources, such American Kinetix (AX). AX is a much larger NGO intelligence firm with much greater capability than In Obscura. Much of their reporting and analysis corroborates In Obscura. AX below has disseminated an urgent threat just before this In Obscura report you are reading now.

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Their entire report at (EXHIBIT 1). Since its inception, In Obscura has disseminated very similar intelligence warning of escalation and planned attacks on churches and Christians.

IMMEDIATE ACTIONS (CONSIDER)

- Increase security countermeasures and elevated vigilance, situational awareness. This includes training on situational awareness, suspicious activity recognition, and immediate reporting.
- Conduct their own casual yet persistent surveillance before and during services and related activities, especially considering the Holiday season and its first attack on military assets in Washinton DC.
- Senior Elders and Clergy meet and discuss security options
- Expedited Clergy liaison and outreach to local law enforcement
- Consider private armed security or off-duty law enforcement plus-up for the Holiday.
- Identify and meet with members of the congregation who are legally authorized to carry concealed firearms. Those who are retired military and civilian law enforcement, or active law enforcement, in the absence of a church security team **MUST** take the lead and initiate security countermeasures. Coordinate this with your insurance firms and local law enforcement to ensure safety and deconfliction.

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MISSED OPPORTUNITIES WAITING FOR COUNTERMEASURES

- Published reporting of target intelligence and surveillance against churches, scant but corroborated. Mostly undetected, have been reported to police who have not largely shared this with churches.
- The now fatal seriousness of church attacks and the terror attacks inside the U.S. and target intelligence collection at churches and related organizations means a pre-attack identification of your church for attack. Yet widespread neglect.
- Pastoral rejection and silent refusal. Prior In Obscura report disseminated the very recent report on this culture of rejection by Christian Warrior Training (Substack). In Obscura CEO has experienced this constantly but was unaware of how prominent this is nationwide.
- Do NOT be naïve to think these groups are unaware of this rejection culture and will NOT exploit it. CEO is also aware of prior case law against churches citing failure to provide a secure environment

Multiple extremist networks, including AQAP-linked operatives and ISIS cells, have established operational presence across at least fifteen U.S. states, with several—Pennsylvania, Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Louisiana, New York, Texas, Virginia/DMV, and California—showing signs of surveillance, rehearsals, and active pre-attack preparations. This pattern indicates a likely synchronized nationwide attack window in mid-December, targeting veteran communities, military installations, and law enforcement facilities. Execution could exceed prior domestic threat cycles, causing significant disruptions to aviation, emergency response, and public confidence, with risks to military families and civilian soft targets.

KEY JUDGMENTS:

- High confidence: Pennsylvania’s inclusion—specifically veteran-dense communities near the Flight 93 crash site—signals an attempt to frame the attack as a symbolic “historical completion,” mirroring Al-Qa’ida’s long-standing interest in anniversary resonance and unfinished narratives.
- Moderate to high confidence: Arizona indicators—including confirmed aviation rehearsals and anomalous onboard incidents—

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suggest operational testing of behavioral detection thresholds and potential probing of airline crew responses.

- High confidence: Colorado's presence of a chemically trained advanced cell indicates a threat vector beyond standard explosives, raising the risk of combined-modality attacks or secondary contamination objectives.
- High confidence: Florida and Louisiana exhibit persistent ISIS-linked activity, including an active cell tied to the New Orleans attacker responsible for 14 deaths and safe houses still operating in Florida. These states remain high-priority nodes with intact support infrastructure.
- Moderate confidence: New York's reported sticky-bomb alerts to NYPD imply active reconnaissance or probing of police vehicle vulnerabilities—a tactic consistent with urban guerrilla approaches and anti-police targeting doctrine.
- High confidence: Texas (Houston and Dallas) and North Carolina (Fort Bragg/Fayetteville) both show patterns of veteran-targeting chatter, consistent with extremist focus on demoralizing military-adjacent communities and attacking symbolic centers of U.S. martial identity.
- High confidence: Virginia, the broader DMV region, and Washington, D.C. are repeatedly cited for symbolic value, with explicit reference to FBI headquarters—indicating adversary intent to degrade federal counterterrorism morale and generate maximum media impact.
- Moderate to high confidence: California's combination of active cells and southern border infiltration aligns with the state's well-established role as an entry corridor and extremist transit node.
- Moderate confidence: Washington State and Nevada represent distinct categories: military-community targeting (Joint Base Lewis-McChord) and mass-casualty soft-target ambition ("Las Vegas soft

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target” designation). Both fit the broader mosaic of opportunistic and symbolic targeting.

SITUATION REPORT (SITREP):

Current intelligence streams identify a dispersed, multi-state extremist presence that appears to be in advanced pre-operational posture. The footprint spans from the East Coast to the Pacific Northwest, indicating a decentralized model rather than a single hierarchical command node. This structure enables asymmetric resilience—if one cell is compromised, others retain autonomous capability.

Pennsylvania’s repeated mention in AQAP media products, especially surrounding the Flight 93 crash area, demonstrates a deliberate effort to attach historical symbolism to upcoming operations. Such messaging typically precedes attack cycles where ideological framing is as important as tactical execution.

Arizona’s aviation-related anomalies—including pre-attack rehearsal behaviors and unusual onboard incidents—suggest an adversary probing aircrew responses, TSA behavioral detection gaps, and airline security protocols. This pattern indicates reconnaissance or dry-run activity and may be tied to a separate aviation-sector threat parallel to the ground-centric operation.

Colorado’s confirmed advanced cell with chemical training represents a major escalation in capability and ambition. Chemical skill sets within domestic extremist networks are rare and typically reserved for high-impact scenario planning. The presence of such a cell inside the CONUS environment marks a significant red flag for blended-attack methodologies.

Florida and Louisiana continue to function as operational and logistical hubs for ISIS-linked actors. The unresolved sleeper cell responsible for killing 14 individuals in Louisiana, combined with Florida safe house retention, indicates ongoing operational integrity within these networks.

New York’s sticky-bomb warnings to NYPD show adversaries evaluating police vehicle vulnerabilities—potentially as part of a campaign to target civil

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authority, create urban panic, and degrade morale within major metropolitan police forces.

The inclusion of Texas, North Carolina, Georgia, Ohio, and Washington State—each tied to veteran or military communities—suggests a coordinated narrative targeting individuals associated with U.S. warfighting history. Extremist chatter consistently highlights veteran communities as “symbolic enemies,” especially those connected to post-9/11 counterterrorism deployments.

Las Vegas, long labeled a “soft target,” remains in the crosshairs for maximum casualty and psychological impact. Its tourism density, crowd volume, and open-access environments provide ideal conditions for rapid media amplification and high body-count potential.

Collectively, the breadth and specificity of these indicators point to a synchronized strike posture approaching readiness. The stated window of mid-December aligns with holiday travel surges and seasonal policing strain—conditions terrorist strategists historically exploit.

COURSES OF ACTION (COA):

Most Likely Course of Action (MLCOA):

Cells continue conducting reconnaissance, rehearsals, and target refinement through mid-December. The operational design likely aims for staggered or simultaneous attacks across several states to overload law enforcement and maximize nationwide panic. Smaller, opportunistic attacks may precede or accompany a larger coordinated operation.

Most Dangerous Course of Action (MDCOA):

A synchronized, multi-state mass-casualty attack occurs within the December window, employing a mix of explosives, chemical agents (Colorado cell), targeted assassinations, soft-target strikes (Las Vegas), and symbolic attacks on federal infrastructure (FBI HQ references). The event causes widespread casualties, grounding of travel systems, state-level emergency declarations, and a national domestic security crisis.

Least Likely Course of Action (LLCOA):

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Adversary networks abort the attack cycle entirely due to internal disruption, unexpected law enforcement activity, or breakdown in command-and-control. Complete abandonment of the plot is unlikely given the breadth, maturity, and ideological framing already observed.

CONUS IMPACT (CONPACT):

A coordinated multi-state attack would overwhelm local police agencies, trigger synchronized emergency responses across multiple jurisdictions, and force federal authorities into immediate national crisis posture. Travel, public events, and military installations would undergo rapid closures or lockdowns. Civilian confidence in law enforcement and homeland security would suffer severe degradation.

A sudden escalation in threat posture would place enormous strain on aviation hubs, interstate highways, rail systems, and major urban centers. Economic consequences would be immediate: disrupted holiday travel, retail collapse, insurance market instability, and temporary shutdown of high-profile entertainment and tourism venues.

Federal agencies would likely re-prioritize counterterrorism above all other security missions, reversing recent focus shifts and triggering emergency legislative action. Political discourse would rapidly harden around national-security measures and domestic force protection.

EMPHASIS ADDED

MISSIONARY / NGO IMPACT:

Faith-based workers, missionaries, and NGOs operating in veteran-heavy communities or transiting major hubs face heightened exposure risks during the mid-December window. Increased police presence, emergency alerts, and unpredictable shutdowns may force rapid changes to itineraries.

Missionary teams may face indirect targeting due to their proximity to military families, veterans, police-heavy communities, or symbolic faith-oriented locations. NGOs could also be impacted by local government lockdowns, evacuation orders, or temporary closures of public venues.

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Travel through states flagged as having active cells—such as Arizona, Florida, Louisiana, Texas, Virginia, New York, and Nevada—should be reconsidered or delayed where possible. Crisis-management plans, emergency rendezvous points, and communications redundancies should be activated immediately.

CONCLUSION:

Indicators suggest a broad, dispersed extremist network inside the United States is entering the final stages of pre-operational preparation, with a likely execution window beginning in mid-December. The scale, symbolism, and geographic diversity of the flagged states imply a campaign designed to overwhelm law enforcement, generate national shock, and exploit current gaps in domestic counterterrorism posture. Immediate vigilance, increased reporting, and localized preparedness actions are essential for federal agencies, states, military families, missionaries, and civilian communities.
