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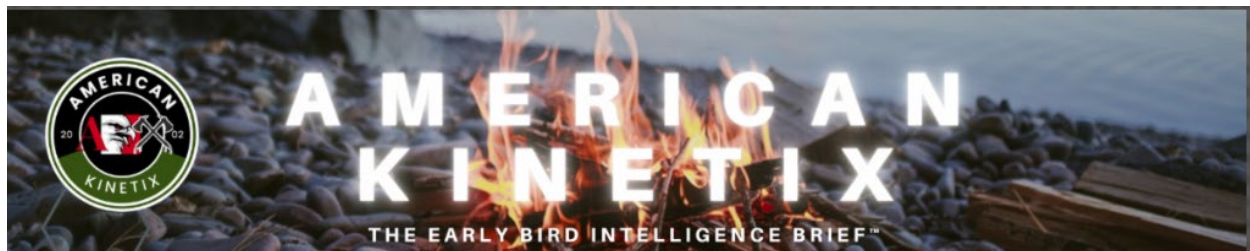

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IN OBSCURA INTRODUCTION

This is only the portion of the Early Bird daily report pertaining to the current Nigeria threat environment but also includes a pointed assessment of Christian Missionaries in country today. This is because American Kinetix is a Non-Governmental Organization funded by born-again Christians who are former and retired US National and Military Intelligence agents, case officers, operatives Special Operators, much larger than In Obscura, a solo operated organization with the very similar professional background.

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THE REPORT

What is this report about?

This report assesses the deteriorating security environment across Nigeria during the 14–15 May 2026 reporting period, with particular focus on ISWAP operations in Borno State, the expanding Abuja infrastructure threat, and the political fallout from the Zamfara market airstrike. The report evaluates operational risks to government personnel, foreign nationals, NGOs, and commercial operators over the next 48–96 hours.

BOTTOM LINE UP FRONT (BLUF):

Nigeria's security environment remains at a HIGH / SEVERE threat level as ISWAP sustains offensive momentum across northeastern Nigeria despite suffering notable leadership losses in Lake Chad.

The MNJTF airstrike that killed senior ISWAP figures Bako Gorgore and Aba-Ibrahim represents a tactical counterterrorism success but has not disrupted ISWAP's operational tempo, territorial consolidation, or siege conditions around Damboa and Dikwa.

The Abuja critical infrastructure threat tied to the April 13 Nigeria Customs Service warning remains unresolved entering its eighth week, with elevated concern that ISWAP-aligned sleeper cells could attempt retaliatory or symbolic attacks against aviation or detention infrastructure.

Simultaneously, the Tumfa market airstrike controversy in Zamfara is generating political and legal pressure on the Nigerian Air Force, likely reducing airstrike tempo in northwestern Nigeria and creating exploitable freedom of movement for bandit and jihadist networks.

Overall, the operational picture indicates continued state security overstretch, deteriorating freedom of movement in multiple regions, elevated kidnapping and ambush risk, and worsening conditions for humanitarian and NGO operations nationwide.

KEY JUDGMENTS:

- ISWAP retains operational initiative across southern Borno despite losing senior commanders in the Lake Chad theater. Leadership attrition has not translated into degraded attack capability or reduced territorial control.

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- Damboa is approaching effective encirclement conditions, with IED interdiction, reconnaissance activity, and drone surveillance indicating a high probability of follow-on assault activity within days.
- Abuja remains under an unresolved elevated infrastructure threat environment, with aviation and detention facilities assessed as likely symbolic targets for jihadist or affiliated sleeper-cell activity.
- The Tumfa airstrike investigation is creating operational hesitation within Nigerian air operations, likely weakening deterrence against armed groups in Zamfara, Sokoto, and Katsina.
- Humanitarian operating conditions in northeastern Nigeria are deteriorating rapidly as displacement increases and road access becomes increasingly dependent on armed escort and real-time intelligence clearance.
- Nigeria’s broader security posture reflects a fragmented and reactive counterinsurgency environment in which simultaneous jihadist, bandit, separatist, and intercommunal threats continue to outpace centralized state response capacity.

SITUATION REPORT (SITREP):

The most significant operational development during the reporting period was the MNJTF strike in the Lake Chad region that killed two senior ISWAP leaders, Bako Gorgore and Aba-Ibrahim. Nigerian and coalition forces characterized the operation as a major counter-leadership success targeting operational planning and logistics coordination within ISWAP’s island resupply network. Despite the strike, ISWAP activity remained uninterrupted across southern Borno, demonstrating continued resilience and decentralized command capability.

Conditions around Damboa continue to worsen. Persistent IED attacks along the Damboa–Maiduguri corridor and the continued closure of the Biu–Damboa bridge have effectively isolated the garrison. ISWAP reconnaissance operations, including drone overflights and motorbike surveillance, suggest battlefield preparation activity consistent with prior assault patterns. The report assesses the probability of a direct attack on Damboa’s 19 Brigade positions within 48–96 hours as HIGH.

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Dikwa and surrounding areas remain under severe humanitarian strain. More than 12,000 displaced persons from Marte LGA are now concentrated near Dikwa following ISWAP territorial consolidation in the Lake Chad corridor. Humanitarian agencies have suspended resettlement activity, while security officials acknowledge insufficient reinforcement capacity following the withdrawal from Marte.

In northwestern Nigeria, political fallout from the Tumfa market airstrike continues to intensify. The National Human Rights Commission formally launched an investigation into the Nigerian Air Force strike, while legislative pressure increased through Senate oversight actions. International scrutiny has amplified civilian casualty reporting, increasing domestic and international pressure on Abuja. The resulting operational caution may significantly reduce air support operations in bandit-dominated areas during the coming days.

The Abuja threat environment remains one of the most strategically concerning elements of the reporting period. The unresolved April 13 Customs Service memo warning of planned attacks against Nnamdi Azikiwe International Airport, Kuje Correctional Centre, and Wawa detention infrastructure remains active entering week eight. Analysts assess that continued elevated security posture may now be creating vigilance fatigue at checkpoints and access-control sites, increasing vulnerability to a complex or opportunistic attack scenario.

COURSES OF ACTION (COA):

Most Likely Course of Action (MLCOA):

ISWAP sustains pressure operations across southern Borno while avoiding large-scale decisive engagements until conditions around Damboa further deteriorate. Additional IED interdictions, drone reconnaissance, and probing attacks are likely over the next several days. Bandit groups in northwestern Nigeria exploit reduced Nigerian Air Force operational tempo to intensify kidnappings, levy enforcement, and road ambush activity. Abuja remains under elevated alert without confirmed attack execution.

Most Dangerous Course of Action (MDCOA):

ISWAP conducts a coordinated assault against Damboa or executes a symbolic high-profile attack within Abuja targeting aviation, detention, or government infrastructure. Simultaneous bandit mass-abduction operations in Zamfara or Katsina could further strain

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already overstretched federal response resources. Such developments would significantly undermine confidence in Tinubu government security management and potentially trigger broader international evacuation or restriction measures.

Least Likely Course of Action (LLCOA):

The Lake Chad leadership strike produces meaningful operational disruption inside ISWAP networks, slowing offensive activity and allowing Nigerian forces to restore corridor access near Damboa and Dikwa. Concurrently, Abuja security forces identify and dismantle the alleged sleeper-cell network tied to the April 13 threat memo. Current reporting does not support this trajectory.

CONUS IMPACT (CONPACT):

The evolving Nigerian security crisis carries implications for U.S. diplomatic, humanitarian, and commercial operations across West Africa. Continued deterioration may force additional embassy staffing reductions, disrupt energy-sector operations, and increase demand for private security and evacuation services supporting Western personnel in-country. Persistent ISWAP resilience despite coalition operations also reinforces broader concerns about jihadist adaptation and cross-border extremist mobility across the Sahel corridor.

MISSIONARY/NGO IMPACT:

Missionary and NGO operations in northeastern and northwestern Nigeria face severe mobility and survivability challenges. Armed escort requirements, increasing checkpoint risk, route interdiction, and expanding displacement pressures significantly reduce freedom of movement for aid personnel. Abuja remains viable for limited operations but under elevated infrastructure threat conditions. NGO and faith-based organizations operating in Borno, Zamfara, Kaduna, Plateau, Sokoto, Katsina, and the southeast should maintain hardened movement protocols, avoid overnight travel, and sustain active contingency evacuation planning.

CONCLUSION:

Nigeria's security environment continues trending toward greater fragmentation and operational instability despite isolated tactical successes by federal and coalition forces. ISWAP retains strategic momentum in the northeast, while bandit and insurgent actors

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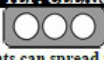
exploit political and operational constraints elsewhere in the country. The unresolved Abuja threat environment, worsening humanitarian conditions in Borno, and expanding northwest insecurity collectively indicate no near-term stabilization trajectory. Foreign personnel, NGOs, missionaries, and commercial operators should anticipate sustained elevated risk conditions across much of Nigeria through the near term. **///END///**
